Alberta Education has earned accolades from universities around the world for the quality of students that come out of its local and international schools. The Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) assesses the reading, math and science literacy of 15-year-old students every three years.

In 2018, 600,000 students, representing some 32 million 15year-olds from schools in the 78 participating countries and economies, including Mexico, took the two-hour PISA test. Canada is the only English-speaking country in the world's top 10.

Based on a bicultural curriculum, our program focuses on the following subjects:

LANGUAGE ARTS

<u>Your child will study and create his or her own texts</u>, including oral, print, and visual texts, as he or she develops listening-speaking, reading-writing, viewing-representing, and inquiry and research skills.

MATH

<u>Understanding reasonings, rates, and proportions.</u> Your child will understand perfect squares and square roots, and solve problems involving percents, rates, ratios, and proportions. At

They will multiply and divide positive fractions, mixed numbers, and whole numbers. Your child will solve problems involving the Pythagorean theorem, area, volume, and probability of independent events.

SOCIAL STUDIES

How do people from different societies see the world and how do they influence each other? Contact between societies that view the world differently has shaped our world. Through inquiry, the student will reflect on his or her own worldview and evaluate the influence of the past on the present. By examining historical examples drawn from Japan, Renaissance Europe, and Spanish and Aztec societies, your child will better understand how contact between societies can bring about change.

SCIENCE

How do hydraulics work and why do we have an epiglottis? Students apply this 8th grade science vocabulary as they investigate machines and the human body. They experiment with liquids and gases to interpret their uses in everyday situations, and learn how light travels through different materials and how vision works.
